Sub: Public Health and Preventive Medicine – Immunization - Measles Rubella Vaccination Campaign conducted in the State since 6th February 2017 – Extension of the campaign from 1st March to 15th March 2017– certain instructions issued - regarding.

All the Deputy Directors of Health Services are informed that the Measles Rubella vaccination campaign which is being conducted since 6th February 2017 onwards, is now extended till 15th March, 2017 to achieve 100 percent coverage.

HUD wise targets and coverage report up to 25th February 2017, is enclosed for ready reference. The Deputy Directors of Health Services are requested to conduct the campaign till 15th March, 2017 and send daily achievement report in the prescribed format to this directorate.

The revised strategy to conduct the Measles Rubella Vaccination Campaign between 1st and 15th March 2017, based on the recommendations of State Immunization Advisory Committee Meeting held on 22.2.17, is as follows:

1. Extended Campaign Period

Measles Rubella Vaccination Campaign period is extended from 1st to 15th March 2017, including all Saturdays and Sundays.

2. Continuation of the current strategy

School, ICDS/HSC and special outreach sessions are to be conducted as per the micro plans prepared based on the guidelines already issued.

3. Deployment of Personnel

- 3.1. On Routine immunization days, facility based MR vaccination and school based vaccination should be conducted.
- 3.2. On other days, Facility based MR vaccination, School and outreach sessions should be conducted.
- 3.3. On Sundays, only Facility based MR vaccination and Special outreach sessions in locations like large apartment complexes, police quarters, railway quarters, slum clearance boards, government staff quarters etc., should be conducted. RBSK School Health Teams and Hospital on Wheels along with required vaccinators should conduct special outreach sessions.

Accordingly vaccinators, supervisors, volunteers and doctors are to be deployed.

4. Facility based strategy

- 4.1 In addition to the Schools & Outreach sessions, daily sessions are to be conducted on all days from March 1st to 15th March 2017, in the below mentioned institutions, so as to provide multiple opportunities for the parents to get their children immunized.
 - a. All the Rural/Urban Primary Health Centres
 - b. Government Hospitals
 - c. Government Medical College Hospitals

- d. Private Medical College Hospitals (if required in that location)
- e. Major Paediatric Hospitals in private sector (if required in that location)
- f. Empanelled Hospitals under Hon'ble Chief Minister's Comprehensive Health Insurance Scheme (if required in that location)
- 4.2 In all the facility based sessions including Private, Government Hospitals and Medical College Hospital, the vaccinator (VHN/UHN/SHN) of the concerned area with one doctor should conduct the session.
- 4.3 AEFI Kit with guidelines should be available with the teams.

5. Special Outreach sessions

- 5.1 On Sundays, as mentioned above, special outreach sessions in locations like large apartment complexes, police quarters, railway quarters, slum clearance boards, government staff quarters etc., should be conducted.
- 5.2 All DDHS should ensure that such special outreach sessions should be conducted in the presence of medical officer with AEFI kit.

6. Micro plan

The Deputy Director of Health Services should revise and finalize a detailed micro plan for the extended MR vaccination period during the next two weeks.

7. Target Children

Irrespective of the Vaccination camp location the target children are from 9 completed months to 15 years. All school sessions should cover under five Children in the surroundings also. Similarly outreach sessions and facility based campaign should also immunize under five, school going and non-school going children to ensure multiple opportunities for the children to get immunized.

8. Health Education

- 8.1 District coordination committee meeting may be conducted again under the chairmanship of the district collector to get maximum coordination from the school authorities, ICDS department, IMA, IAP and community based service organisations like Lions Club international.
- 8.2 Intensive health education measures such as mike announcements, cable TV scrolling, pamphlets etc., have to be organized extensively to sensitize and motivate all the left out children for MR vaccination.

8.3 DDHS are requested to instruct the Block medical officers to conduct meetings with all the concerned headmasters and teachers of the schools in their blocks and also Parent Teachers Meeting should be convened at the earliest to sensitize and motivate all the left out children for MR vaccination.

All DDHS should review the PHC wise/ school wise performance and ensure 100 percent coverage is achieved, since it is critical for elimination of Measles and Rubella. This campaign will help in substantial reduction of IMR due to congenital malformations and therefore, all DDHS should motivate all the health staff, actively involve IAP and IMA and Lions Clubs International and 100 percent coverage is achieved.
