ORDER :

As per the Policy / Prospectus issued every year for the admission to Post Graduate Medical Degree / Diploma / 6 years M.Ch. (Neuro Surgery) and MDS courses, the merit list is being drawn for a Total Mark of 100 by computing the Entrance Examination Marks and the marks for experience (90 marks for entrance examination + 10 marks for experience) and one mark for each completed year after the completion of Compulsory Rotatory Residential Internship (CRRI) is being awarded for experience for both service and non service candidates to a maximum of ten marks and the service candidates are being awarded, one mark per year of service in rural areas and two marks per year of service in hilly, remote and difficult areas. Altogether the total marks awarded for experience will be restricted to 10 marks.

2. In the Government order 1st read above, orders have been issued for awarding of 2 marks for each year of Government service in Hilly regions to a maximum of 5 years, restricting to a total of 10 marks. In Government order 2nd read above, orders have been issued for awarding of 2 marks for each year of Government service to the Doctors who works in the Government Hospitals,

Government Primary Health Centres and Government Medical Colleges at Nagapattinam, Tiruvarur and Ramanathapuram Districts subject to a maximum of 10 marks.

3. In the letter 3rd read above, the Director of Medical Education has requested to issue necessary orders for awarding 2 marks in each year of Government service to the doctors who work in the newly started Government Medical Colleges (except in Chennai) during its initial years of establishment (i.e. From inception to recognition of such College by the Medical Council of India for awarding MBBS degree), in order to improve the faculty strength and to motivate the doctors working in the newly established Government Medical Colleges.

4. In the letter 4th read above, the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India has stated that as a natural corollary, in absence of clearly notified categories of areas, it would be difficult to administer any measure to improve availability of doctors in rural / remote areas and requested to identify, demarcate and notify areas into Urban, Rural, Difficult and Remote in the State of Tamil Nadu to provide Health Care Facilities.

5. In the letter 5th read above, the Additional Director of Medical Education / Secretary, Selection Committee has stated that every year the Secretary, Selection Committee get the list of Hilly / Remote / Difficult areas from the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine and Director of Medical and Rural Health Services so as to award of additional marks for the service candidates serving in those areas and during the process of selection and admission of candidates to Post Graduate Courses, the Secretary, Selection Committee has to face litigation with regard to recognition of Hilly / Remote / Difficult areas and therefore the Secretary, Selection Committee has sent the detailed list of Hospitals located at Rural / Hilly / Remote / Difficult areas received from the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine and Director of Medical and Rural Health Services and requested necessary orders to finalize the Prospectus.

6. The Government, after careful examination of the request of the Additional Director of Medical Education / Secretary, Selection Committee at para 5 above, notify the Rural / Hilly / Remote / Difficult Areas as annexed with this order for award of bonus marks for experience to the service candidates, at the time of admitting them into Post Graduate Medical Degree / Diploma / 6 years M.Ch. (Neuro Surgery) and MDS courses:

- (i) all Primary Health Centres in rural areas and hospitals on wheels attached to the rural Primary Health Centres at Annexure-I shall be awarded 1 mark per year of service,
- ii) the list of hilly area Primary Health Centres in Annexure-II and Remote / Difficult area Primary Health Centres in Annexure-III under the control of Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine shall be awarded 2 marks per year of service.

- iii) the list of Hilly / Remote / Difficult area Government Hospitals under the control of Director of Medical and Rural Health Services in Annexure-IV shall be awarded 2 marks per year of service and
- iv) the recently established Government Medical Colleges and new Government Medical Colleges in various Districts (except Chennai) which will be started in future i.e. from the date of inception to till the date of recognition by Government of India for award of MBBS degree shall be awarded 2 marks per year of service.

7. The Director of Medical Education and the Additional Director of Medical Education / Secretary, Selection Committee are directed to take necessary action accordingly.
